Key relevant project experience

Addenbrookes University Hospitals, Cambridge, LMB Bay Refit

This project involves the redevelopment and refurbishment of the LMB Bay 13 Extension on the Addenbrookes Hospital Campus. The scheme will provide meeting and teaching rooms, as well as a common room for the Clinical School.

Addenbrookes Hospital, Cambridge, New Ward Block

A new ward block to cater for 120 beds, the facility was to be constructed under an extremely tight deadline, consulting with nursing staff and in full compliance with NHS HTM guidance. Prior to contractor procurement, the project funding was not secured so the project was put on hold.

Parkside Federation Academies, Cambridge

Radegund Hall was the first phase of a wider redevelopment of Coleridge Community College supporting its growth to become a five form entry (5FE) school. The hall provides a new "heart" for the school, a place in which the school staff and pupils can informally meet, talk and interact, and bring the school community together. The building achieves BREEAM 'Very Good' and was the winner of the Cambridge Design and Construction Award in 2013 for best Large Building.

Coleridge Community College, Cambridge

The Sports Hall was the second phase of a wider redevelopment of Coleridge Community College supporting its growth to become a five form entry (5FE) school. It enhances the sports provision for the Parkside Federation Academy, creating a 'sports village' linking all sports facilities. The building achieves BREEAM 'Very Good' and enriches their curriculum offering whilst improving the overall perception of the school.
